During brief call on Mrs. Meir in New York on June 17 she raised subject of Eichmann. Ambassador Comay participated in part of this conversation.

1. Mrs. Meir noted the possibility of a Ben-Gurion-Frondizi meeting but indicated there was as yet nothing definite on this.

2. Comay reviewed his conversation with Barco (USUN sent Department 1405) and stressed that he had emphasized that normal negotiation process between the parties had not been "exhausted". Comay reported on possibility of the Security Council hearing parties only on Wednesday. Mrs. Meir made no comment.

3. Both Mrs. Meir and Comay commented on the speed with which the GGA had taken the matter to the UN. In this connection they seemed to feel that Amadeo was a particular factor and Comay opined that he "wished to make a name for himself"; perhaps paving the way for his becoming a judge on the International Court. They noted with some asperity that during World War Two Amadeo had been considered a "Nazi agent in the Argentine Foreign Office", that there "records" on this, and that he had even been mentioned in "despatches".
